At a recent Coffee Morning someone asked me what I thought would happen to a particular



world leader...would they go to heaven or not? My response was to ask the questioner what they thought. Our conversation developed as we shared together our views about the world leader, although in reality our focus was on how we view God. In part this was based on scripture, but also with our lived experience and reasoning.

The following week I was with another group reflecting on scripture and spirituality. I made the comment that we are all theologians, to which some laughed, some looked bemused and others protested that they weren't clever enough. I quickly retorted because during the conversation to that point they had all been theologically reflecting. One had spoken about God's intricate attention to detail in the creation of delicate flowers she had seen in a local park, whilst another spoke about being overwhelmed with the awesome strength and presence of God when visiting the Grand Canyon.

Like it or not, as Christians we are all theologians. "Theo" means God and "ology" means thinking about. So every time we think about God we are doing theology, and your thinking is as valid as the next persons. An oft repeated comment I hear is that people don't feel clever enough to go to a Bible Study. This saddens me, although I think for those of us who are not naturally "academic" we distort this to conclude we are not clever enough. Whilst we may not be academic, everyone brings different skills, gifts and insights whenever we gather.

So, to all you new found theologians out there, we invite you to join us this August as we journey together as a Circuit through the Book of Revelation. Each Sunday evening in August we will take an overview of the Revelation. See the side panel for further information.
