A message of hope and renewal from the Revd Peter Lyth.....

Almost as soon as Christmas was over and definitely before New Year's Day, our local paper shop had new stocks of Cadbury's Crème eggs. Many of you will know that I have a particular weakness for chocolate and it has been a test of willpower for me to resist them.

So far, I have been successful! But in the shops, there has been a constant reminder that Easter is coming, despite a lack of mention of Jesus, the true reason that we celebrate the festival. This year, Easter is early, meaning that Easter Sunday is in March, albeit the very last day. To me, the message of Easter has a particular resonance this year.

Easter Sunday is my final day as a serving minister in the United Reformed Church. But what has the message of Easter have to say to the churches? It's hard to escape the sense that something is changing. In recent times, three of the churches in the circuit have closed, as has one of the United Reformed churches in Southport. Others are hanging on to a precarious existence and, I think it is fair to say that many church members are fearful. But the message of Easter is, above all a message of renewal and hope.

Maybe God has something new in store for us. A constant theme of the gospels is the death of the old and the birth of the new. In a recent lectionary reading, Jesus said, "whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it" (Mark 8:35). It reminds us that sometimes we have to let go of the old so that God can do something new. This may be very different to that which we are used to – the early disciples failed to recognise the risen Jesus when he first appeared.

But I am convinced that God has a plan for His people. Let us pray that we can be people of the resurrection – renewed in the form that God wants us to be. But I hope that we can continue to have Crème Eggs too! Peter Lyth

Gaza Appeal

The Methodist Church in Britain has launched an appeal to support the emergency work being carried out in Gaza by the Methodist Liaison Office's partners.

"The scale of the destruction and tragic loss of life in so short a space of time is incomparable to any other conflict in recent times. We grieve for all lives lost on October 7 and in the subsequent fighting. There is no justification for such widespread killing of tens of thousands of innocent people and we are gravely concerned for the entire population of the Gaza strip."

Methodist Liaison Office (MLO) supports several partners in the region, many of whom have had to adapt the support they offer in light of the Israeli Defense Forces' military campaign.

The Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees (<u>DSPR</u>) which is part of the Near East Council of Churches (NECC) and the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre which had just opened a clinic in Gaza when the violence started, are working in the most difficult of circumstances.

The DSPR-NECC says the situation in Gaza is a disaster beyond belief and the impact on people is catastrophic. They are working with some of the most vulnerable civilians and in central and south Gaza their clinic is one of only four centres that continues to operate: they are able to see around 500 people a day.

Their mental health support has reached over 5000 children aged between five and nine through open days and other activities in different shelters and schools.
